Oftentimes the foster is willing to cover the cost of/provide (either in full or in part) the basic necessities, such as food, litter, treats, toys, etc. ~ These details will be worked out once/if approved to foster & will be part of the contract.

The foster would also be available to take kitty(s) to/from the vet for appointments as needed, however, all medical expenses are covered in full (and any medical decisions are made) by us, the Rescue, for the remainder of the cat's life.
